Purposes, Legal Titles and Duration of the Processing of Personal Data

Most of the personal data that we process about our customers, suppliers and other commercial parties, is held in connection with, the **offer and provision of our services**. If you decide to pay us a visit, your movement in our premises is monitored by **a camera system in order to protect property and personal security**. Our access to CCTV footage is restricted – we can obtain it on request, especially in the event of a security incident.

All of the aforementioned personal data that, arises from our communication and interaction with each other, is governed by, the internal data protection system, and is in accordance with the applicable legislation. We therefore, control access to personal data, including technical measures for, it's security and the duration of it's existence, to the maximum extent possible.

Transfer of Personal Data

We use all personal data collected from, customers and third parties **for internal use only**, protect it from misuse **and do not disclose it to third parties**, without prior notice or consent.

In certain cases, you have the right to erasure. Furthermore, we are obliged to, transfer your personal data to the data controller/processor of your choice upon your request.

If you are convinced that, we do not handle your data appropriately, and in accordance with the legal standards, you have the possibility to, lodge a complaint with, the supervisory authority which is, the Office for Personal Data Protection.
